




Introduction



On 1st July 2018 the Colchester University NHS Foundation Trust and the Ipswich Hospital NHS Trust merged to become ESNEFT.

Merge means to join together.



As part of our plan when we merged we promised to make major changes to the way we deliver services.



In spring 2018 the government gave us £69.3 million to improve our buildings.




We have written a plan called "Building for Better Care" which sets out how we will spend this money.



This plan has 2 parts:

• **Part 1** – to improve emergency care at both Colchester and Ipswich hospitals.



• **Part 2** – to build new facilities for elective care and day surgery at Colchester hospital.

This consultation relates only to Part 2.



What we want to change




We want to build a new centre for elective orthopaedic surgery.



This new centre will have at least 48 inpatient beds.



It will have 6 specialist operating theatres.



It will specialise in hip and knee replacement operations.



We want to build this new centre at Colchester Hospital.



We think that this new will improve elective orthopaedic surgery because:

• Fewer operations will be cancelled.



• The waiting list for an operation will be shorter.



• We will be able to do more operations.



• Care after an operation will be better.



• There will be more staff.



• We will be able to research new treatments.



We have talked with our staff about our plans have listened to their views.



Nobody will lose their job.



The staff who provide care at Colchester and lpswich hospitals will continue to provide care at the new centre.



We think it will take 4 years to build the new centre.

It will cost about £44 million.



What will not change



The new centre will only be for when you have your operation.

All of your outpatient appointments before and after your operation will be at your local hospital.



You will also go to your local hospital for:

• Physiotherapy



• Occupational therapy



• Diagnostic services



• Emergency care



If you have funded patient transport to hospital you will continue to receive this to go to the new centre.



About our options

The Ipswich Hospital

NHS Trust

Colchester Hospital University NHS Foundation Trust Last year 3,400 had elective orthopaedic surgery at Colchester and Ipswich hospitals.



The government gave us money to build a new centre.

When we started planning for the new centre we thought that there were 3 options.

1. To build a completely new centre at Copdock, halfway between Colchester and Ipswich

We decided not to build at Copdock because:

• it would cost too much

- clinicians said that it would be too far away from supporting services like x-rays, blood tests and scans.









2. To build the centre at Ipswich Hospital.



The Ipswich Hospital

NHS Trust

We decided not to build at Ipswich Hospital because:

• We would need to spend money to move some services to other locations.

This would mean that we would not have enough money to build the new centre.



3. To build the centre at Colchester Hospital.



Colchester Hospital

University NHS Foundation Trust

We think this is the best option because:

• The population of Colchester is growing faster than Ipswich. This means more babies are being born or more people are moving to the area.



• Of the 3,400 operations carried out last year, less than half of the people would have to travel for their operation.



• There is space to build a new centre.




• Other clinical services are close and easy to access.



• The extra beds in the new centre will free up beds in Colchester and Ipswich for day surgery or emergency surgery.



- It is easier to get to Colchester Hospital.
- There are better links to public transport.



 A single centre will mean that there is more space at both Colchester and lpswich hospitals to improve other services.



We know that our population is growing and getting older.



The new centre would be able to expand to have more beds and provide more operations as more people need orthopaedic surgery.



What happens next?



This consultation runs from 12 February 2020 until 25 March 2020.



During this time we will read all the responses and suggestions we receive.



After 25 March we will use your responses to write a final report and proposals for the Board.



The Board will consider our proposals and will decide what to do by summer 2020.
