



Finishing a course of radiotherapy

Returning to normal – how long will it take?

Side effects of radiotherapy often reach their peak 7–14 days after treatment has finished. They then settle and gradually improve over the following weeks or months.

It is difficult to put a timescale on this because everyone's recovery rate is different.

Skin care

Continue to follow our skin care advice for at least two weeks after your treatment has finished or until it has healed, and then gradually start to return to your normal routine.

The skin in the area which has been treated will always be more sensitive to the sun so please cover it with clothing or a sunscreen of at least factor 30 when outdoors.

Follow-up appointments

Most patients have a follow-up appointment for between four and 12 weeks after treatment. The timing of this appointment will be decided by your consultant. You may be given this appointment at the end of treatment or it may be sent to you in the post.

Please call us if you do not receive an appointment.

If you have outstanding chemotherapy appointments after your radiotherapy, your follow-up appointment will be arranged by the chemotherapy staff.

Letting your GP know

Details of your treatment will be sent to your GP so that your records can be kept up to date.

Returning to work

If you have been off work while you have been undergoing radiotherapy, you should return only when you feel ready. It is probably wise to give yourself time to get over your treatment. This is something you may wish to discuss with your oncologist or GP.
