Executive summary

The Council of Governors meets four times a year. Throughout the COVID-19 global pandemic, it met more sporadically, and virtually, using Microsoft Teams.

As we begin to move out of the pandemic, our normal Trust governance arrangements will resume, with four meetings of the Council per year. Many have expressed a desire to meet in person, whilst it is also acknowledged that virtual meetings are very convenient and efficient, and more accessible for some, particularly our public observers.

It is therefore proposed that two meetings per year should be held in person, one in the Ipswich area, and one in the Colchester area (venues to be confirmed). The remaining two meetings should be held virtually, using Microsoft Teams. The meetings would alternate, one in person, one virtually.

The Council should note that the Annual Members Meeting is considered a public CoG meeting. It is proposed that the Annual Members Meeting is included in the four meetings and that it counts as one of the two virtual meetings in the year. This is because public members attending more than doubled between 2019 and 2020, so it clearly works.

After full consideration, it is considered that a hybrid version of in person and virtual for a meeting in public is not ideal, and this option is not therefore offered for consideration.

The Council is asked to consider these proposals. If agreed, our June meeting will be held in person in the Ipswich area.

Action Required of the Board/Committee

The meeting is asked to:

Discuss, consider and approve how The Council of Governors meeting are run in the future and shared publicly.

The recommendation is for four meetings a year, two in person, two virtually, one of which is the Annual Members Meeting.
