As part of the review of governance arrangements and support to the Council, all Terms of Reference have been reconsidered and revised.					
The Trust Constitution at 5.9 confirms the committees, sub committees and joint committees established by the Council of Governors as:					
Council of Governors Standards Committee					
Appointments and Performance Committee.					
The Council may not delegate any of its powers to these Committees.					
All governors joining the Council are required to meet the Trust values and to sign agreement to the Council of Governors' Code of Conduct. At 1.3 it states:					
Any alleged breach of this Code will be referred to the Council of Governors Standards Committee through the Chair.					
Any decision of the Standards Committee would be presented to the Council for consideration and approval.					
As the Standards Committee has not met for some time, the Terms of Reference are presented for review and approval. Appointments to all Committees were confirmed at the Council meeting in December 2022, whilst there is further work to do on identifying deputies. It is proposed that a meeting of the Committee is held later in 2023/24 to reconsider the Governors' Code of Conduct and propose any subsequent amendments, which may impact on these Terms of Reference.
