## 3. Summary:

#### Overview

The NHS has committed to becoming the world's first health service to achieve carbon net zero. The 'Delivering a Net Zero Health Service' report outlines ambitious targets for carbon reduction, encompassing direct emissions (Scope 1) and indirect emissions (Scopes 2 and 3), including patient and visitor travel, and medicines used at home. The ESNEFT Green Plan (January 2024 - March 2027) aligns with this commitment, detailing strategies for East Suffolk and North Essex NHS Foundation Trust (ESNEFT) to achieve Net Zero.

### **Key Targets**

- 1. NHS Carbon Footprint (Scope 1):
  - Net Zero by 2040.
  - 80% reduction from baseline by 2028-2032.
- 2. NHS Carbon Footprint Plus (Scopes 1, 2, 3):
  - Net Zero + by 2045.
  - 80% reduction from baseline by 2036-2039.

# **Drivers for Change**

- Legal requirements: Civil Contingencies Act 2004, Climate Change Act 2008, Public Services (Social Value) Act 2012.
- NHS mandatory drivers: Sustainable Development Strategy (2014-2020), NHS Carbon Reduction Strategy for England, NHS England Long Term Plan.

#### **ESNEFT Green Plan Highlights**

- Reduction in Carbon Footprint by 4,200t from 2019-20 emissions, ahead of the target for 2022-23.
- Implementation of workforce and system leadership programs, digital transformation, and adaptation measures.
- Significant progress in clinical practice, estates and facilities, travel and transport, food and nutrition, and supply chain and procurement.

#### **Governance and Reporting**

- Trust Board: Strategic oversight and approval of the Green Plan.
- Sustainability Steering Group: Quarterly review and implementation of detailed action plans.
- Net Zero Category Delivery Groups: Category-specific action and feedback.
- Green Champions: Staff involvement and advocacy.
- Monitoring and Reporting: Compliance with NHS Standard Contract, ERIC data, and HM Treasury sustainability reporting.

#### **Future Focus**

- Continuing to drive carbon footprint reduction in line with NHS Net Zero targets.
- Enhancing measurement and quantitative data for NHS Carbon Footprint Plus.

- Strengthening cross-divisional collaboration to address key themes and subgroups.
- Prioritising innovative approaches in challenging areas such as natural gas removal.

ESNEFT, in alignment with NHS's Net Zero commitment, demonstrates significant progress and dedication towards sustainable healthcare. Ongoing efforts and strategic planning are crucial to achieve the set targets and positively impact health and environmental outcomes.
